ELIGIBILITY & REPERTOIRE:

Open to singer/actors of all nationalities, ages 19-32 (born after April 23, 1984 and before January 24, 1998).

Contestants perform four selections, not to exceed a total of 15 minutes:

- a selection from the operatic or operetta repertoire;
- a theatrical selection (any genre) by Kurt Weill;
- a song from the "Golden Age" (pre-1968) American musical theater repertoire; and
- a song from the American musical theater repertoire of 1968 or later.

NEW THIS YEAR: The Kurt Weill Award, in the amount of \$5,000 for outstanding performance of two contrasting selections by Kurt Weill, at least one of which must be non-English-language.
